Difu Simo project mental health awarness campaign

Difu Simo team in collaboration with stakeholders will conduct mental health awareness campaigns in Kilifi county, the first being a 7-days campaign to take place between 3rd and 9th August 2020 involving various engagement venues including:

The key message for the campaign will be that...

"People with mental disorders should not be discriminated and stigmatized but should be assisted to seek help because mental disorders are diseases like any other and there are management options available."

This will be communicated through:

- Songs, dance, spoken word and poem performances encouraging mental health promotion.
- Public educational sessions on mental health by trained mental health specialists.
- Dialogue sessions involving traditional healers and biomedical practitioners
- Interactive promotional activities such as questions and answer sessions on relevant awareness topic to encourage conversations around mental illness.
- Sharing COVID-19 prevention messages from the County public health officials (PHOs) and trained Community Health workers (CHWs)

With a goal of reaching and engaging a broader audience in other parts of the country and globally, we will seek to promote communication of the engagements and messages shared during the campaign using print media, broadcast media and social media networks.

What is Difu Simo?

A mental health awareness campaign in Kilifi County that is using art to create a space for dialogue between the world of biomedicine and traditional medicines with the aim of understanding mental illness from a community perspective and addressing stigma

About Difu Simo

Difu Simo is a Kigiriama phrase which means "Breaking Free". Difu Simo is a Mental Health Awareness Campaign in Kilifi County currently funded by the Wellcome Trust Public Engagement Fund.

The campaign is a collaboration between the Kenya Medical Research Institute-Wellcome Trust (KWTRP), Documentary Institute of Eastern Africa (DIEA), Malindi District Cultural Association (MADCA) and the County Government of Kilifi.

The project is combining the expertise of stakeholders from the scientific research field, film making industry, art industry and experts in the culture and traditions of the Mijikenda community to tackle stigma in mental illness. It is using participatory approaches such as films and art in the form of music, dance and poems to create spaces for dialogue between traditional health practitioners and biomedical practitioners because they are the custodians of health care information in the community and they can play a key role in demystifying myths surrounding mental illness and in encouraging people with these disorders to seek care.

As Professor Charles Newton, a collaborator in the project says:

There are so few practitioners who are able to diagnose and manage mental health conditions in many communities within Kenya, and therefore it is beholden on us to try and utilize all of those that are interested in these disorders and to work together to improve diagnosis and management for mental illnesses.

The involvement of people with mental illness in the campaign is a core component of the campaign strategy and we are engaging them through participatory videos which involves empowering them to use videos to create and





James has a background training in media and communications. He coordinates field activities including participant identification and recruitments and liaison with Kilifi County administrative officials.


